#### THINGS COMPETITORS, PARENTS, AND CHAPERONES SHOULD KNOW

- 1. Parents, coaches and friends may help unload heavy items only, and then they must leave the stable area. Please park vehicles in designated parking area and leave trailers in areas requested by the Virginia Horse Center's Security Guards. Roadways near the barns are for loading and unloading only. Please do not bring your vehicles into roadways near the barns when Rally is in progress.
- 2. Parents may leave messages, etc. for all competitors at the Neutral/Hospitality Zone. Please do not enter Barn at any time except when it is announced that the Barns are open for visitation.
- 4. An EMT is available on the grounds.
- 5. Stall bedding may be purchased at the Horse Centers show office. We do not have access to bedding.
- 6. Competitors do not use stalls other than those assigned to you and your team, but if you need to change stall order for tack or horse placement let management know at the rally office.
- 7. Rally Briefings should be attended by all Team members, Advisors, Chaperones and Parents.
- 8. Parents and friends are reminded that unauthorized assistance may result in elimination from Rally. "Unauthorized Assistance" consists of intervention by any non-competitor in any phase of the Rally.
- 9. All dogs must be kept on a leash.
- 10. Checkout: When all stalls for your Team have been *stripped or cleaned to the satisfaction of the Horse Management Judges*, the Team Members have *completed and returned "Competitor's Rally Response Form"* to the HM Judges Office, the Team Captain should bring the Team Check-out Card, signed by a HM Judge to the Secretary's office to receive the Team Exit Packet containing the Team's HM Forms, Dressage Tests, etc.

The Susan Baizley Perpetual Trophy will be presented this year and in the years to follow, to a Pony Clubber who exhibits a high degree of proficiency at both riding and horse-management for his/her rating level, Sportsmanship to count as well. We thank Susan for donating this wonderful trophy and being a driving force in promoting Dressage in Pony Club.

#### A SPECTATOR'S GUIDE TO DRESSAGE

"The object of Dressage is the harmonious development of the physique and ability of the horse. As a result it makes the horse calm, supple, loose and flexible but also confident, attentive and keen, thus achieving perfect understanding with the rider"

Each year the United States Pony Clubs' Dressage Committee selects which tests will be ridden at each rating level, with the approval of the Board of Governors. This year, all competitor's have the opportunity to choose their own tests, matching their horse's ability to the tests ridden. D's however, have "suggested" tests, as they may not yet have the knowledge to decide on their own level. Each test has a stated purpose on the front. It is important for the rider to understand and try to fulfill this purpose. Each test is written out on paper and describes a series of figures and exercises to be performed in front of one or more judges in a measured enclosed arena. These exercises and figures are designed to show a progressive improvement from elementary to advanced. In addition to showing the judge the rider's increasing skill, the tests also mark the progress of the horse's training. As the rider's balance, seat aids, and correct position improve, so do the horse's gait, activity of the hindquarters, submission and harmony with the rider. Dressage tests are meant to display the horse's increasing gymnastic abilities which are the result of the rider's increasing technical control.

Tests are usually ridden in a "standard" or large arena which measures 20 x 60 meters (about 66 x 198 feet). A "small" arena measures 20 x 40 meters (about 66 x 132 feet). Those riding Intro Level and Training Level test may use a small arena. All other tests are in a large arena. Arenas are divided by imaginary center lines (A to C) and quarter lines. There are letters placed at specific points. Entry into the arena by the competitor is always at A and there is always a judge stationed at C. In advanced levels judges also are stationed at various other letters. The letters E and B are exactly half-way the length of the arena. X is an imaginary letter at the intersection of lines A-C and B-E.

All tests are scored by the judge using a scale of 0 - 10 for each section of the test. The competitor is also scored under "General Impressions". A "0" mark indicates the movement was not executed or the horse or rider fell; a "5" indicates the movement was performed sufficiently; a "10" mark is excellent and almost never seen at any level. After penalty points for errors are subtracted the positive points are converted to a percentage score. In Dressage competitions the higher the score the better.

Although the Dressage committee encourages all to learn their tests "by heart" riders may have their tests read if rally conditions allow at any level below the FEI. Each movement may be read only once and only the reader can only read what is on the test. All riders must ride two tests, and any rider wishing to qualify for Championships must also ride a *Musical Kur* or *Pas de Deux*.

Dress may be formal or informal but must be correct and should not be intermixed. D's may wear polo shirts. Whips are allowed but must not be longer than 43.3" (110cm) including the handle and lash. C's, B's, and A's must use a plain snaffle bridle unless Third Level of above when a double bridle is allowed. D's are allowed to use Kimberwickes, Pelhams or other types of snaffles (not twisted wire, gags or excessively thin). Boots, bandages and side reins are permitted when lunging but not during competition rounds. Martingales, draw reins and "head setting devices" are prohibited at all times. (Very young D1's are allowed to use "anti-grazing" reins if necessary.)

Musical Kurs are required of any rider wishing to qualify for Championships. The Kur is a freestyle ride which includes compulsory movements as well as elective movements set to music. It is judged on technical ability and artistic impressions. A *Pas de Deux* is also set to music and judged much like a Kur.

#### VIRGINIA HORSE CENTER 2018 RULES

- 1. Upon arrival at the Virginia Horse Center, all trailers MUST check in at the Welcome Center (Stable Office).
- 2. No smoking in Coliseum or Barns. This is the law.
- 3. VEHICLES: Drive Carefully. Obey All Traffic Signs. Speed limits are strictly enforced. Every vehicle operator must have a valid driver's license and proof of insurance. The use of vehicles in the camping areas is restricted to regular roadways for entering and exiting only. Vehicles are permitted only if operated in a safe manner (this is a Virginia state law), but may not be used in the Coliseum or in the interior of any of the barns. Four wheelers and ATV's are not permitted on the VHC grounds. Non-powered scooters, bicycles, skateboards, in-line skates, heelers (skates in shoes) are not permitted in the Coliseum or the interior of any of the barns. The VHC reserves the right to prohibit the operation of any vehicle.
- 4. Dogs/Pets: All dogs/pets must have current inoculations for rabies as prescribed by state of residency. No loose dogs/pets are allowed anywhere on the premises. All dogs/pets that are not crated must be on a hand-held or tied leash. Loose dogs/pets will incur a \$100 fine. You must clean up after your dog/pet.

Coliseum: Absolutely no loose dogs/pets allowed in the Coliseum, no dogs/pets are allowed in food service areas of the Coliseum with the exception of service dogs. Absolutely no dogs/pets in the Mezzanine (2nd floor of the Coliseum) under any circumstances with the exception of Service Dogs. We ask that your Service Dog have his/her vest on. Grounds/Parking Areas/Barns/East Complex: All dogs/pets must be on a hand-held or tied leash.

- 5. No trash or sharps in the manure pits. Sharps should be placed in red boxes in barns. Shows will be charged \$1,000 for sharps in the manure pits.
- 6. ALCOHOL: At events serving alcohol, all ABC laws must be followed. If asked to provide Identification for purposes of age validation, you must comply. Those individuals who do no comply will not be served alcohol. Disorderly patrons will be removed from the premises.
- 7. Theft/Vandalsim: Anyone involved in destroying property or found stealing property will be prosecuted to the fullest extent of the law.
- 8. All stalls must have at least one bale of shavings or straw. Sawdust is prohibited. Shavings may be purchased at the Welcome Center (Stable Office).
- 9. No lunging in posted rings. Wiley, Speed, and B Rings NEVER.
- 10. No overnight horses may be stabled in trailers or tied out.
- 11 Horses are absolutely not allowed to be ponied behind any moving vehicles.
- 12. No vehicles allowed in the barns.
- 13. Campers must register at Stable Office.
- 14. Check-In time and Check-Out time subject to show date.
- 15. No gray water is to be dumped on the ground. Sewage arrangements are made through the stable office.
- 16. Campfires are not permitted.

- 17. Campers must keep their sites clean and dispose of refuse in the receptacles provided. All campers will be responsible for leaving the campsite as they found it. Any damage or repairs resulting from negligence shall be the responsibility of the camper.
- 18. All central service buildings and other facilities in the campground are for campers' and exhibitors' use only.
- 19. Firearms and fireworks are not permitted.
- 20. No tent, camper, RV or camping equipment shall be left unattended longer than 24 hours without written permission from campground management.
- 21. Any loss, theft, accident or disturbance should be reported to the Virginia Horse Center Security. Lost and Found is located in the Security Office.
- 22. Virginia Horse Center management reserves the right to remove from the premises any camper or visitor who is in violation of these rules and regulations.
- 23. The Virginia Horse Center shall be held harmless against all claims, costs, losses or liability of every nature and kind asserted against or incurred by camper arising or resulting in any respect from camper's occupancy and use of premises, and/or visitor and visitor's use of premises.
- 24. There will be a fine for anything hooked to or suspended from electrical conduit in the barns. This is extremely dangerous, and electrocution could occur.
